SOUTH CENTRAL COMMUNITY ACTION PARTNERSHIP

Ken Robinette, South Central Community Action Partnership Executive Director, reported on their services provided for 2019 and on present day challenges with the unemployment due to the Coronavirus. They provide assistance in various areas; food, homes, weatherization/energy conservation program and low income home energy assistance. In Gooding County, South Central Community Action Partnership provided \$391,516 in all programs combined for 2019. Mr. Robinette anticipates the 2020 energy assistance benefits will increase 50% or more.
