**PUBLICATION OF UPCOMING COUNTY EVENTS
GOODING COUNTY FAIR AND RODEO**

Shelly Amundsen, NCMC Public Relations, Don Gill, Fair & Rodeo Manager, Elected Officials and 14 citizens joined the meeting. Each Commissioner read press releases explaining the actions of cancelling of the 2020 Fair and Rodeo. Mr. Gill announced that there is a possibility of moving the rodeo dates to September. This will be dependent on the impact of the Coronavirus COVID19 and if the determinations not to extend the Governor's Idaho Rebound Act Phase 4. Gooding County citizen, Mr. Jesse Coit, stated he would have liked to have input prior to the decision being made and that it is the Commissioner's responsibility to ask for that input. 4-H Leader, Robin Ulrich, was concerned with the permission to use the fair facility for 4-H. Don Gill has already offered the arena for their market animal sale, in order to comply with social distancing. It was explained to the group that University of Idaho Extension Gooding County has been working on plans for 4-H. The group explained they only get minimal assistance from the Extension Office personnel and rest is their responsibility. Prosecutor Pember read the response for ICRMP's attorney on the coverage needed for the Market Animal Sale. Treasurer Wines, expressed a thank you to individuals that came to the meeting.

TREASURER

Treasurer Wines presented a request from a tax payer that accidentally sent his payment to the City of Hagerman. The late fee is \$26.16 and interest \$85.97. Commissioner Bolton moved to not grant the application for the cancellation of the late fee and interest on RPH3000016007B. Commissioner Buhler seconded the motion. Motion carried.

INDIGENT

Commissioner Buhler moved to go into an executive session pursuant to IC§31-874 to consider indigent matters. Commissioner Bolton seconded the motion. Roll call vote: Bolton-Yes, Buhler- Yes, Bolduc-Yes. Director, Linda Leguineche and Assistant Director, Kathy Ball joined the meeting. JUVENILE PROBATION

Carol Johnson, Juvenile Probation, introduced the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act program that gives 16-24 aged youth the possibility to get a job through the Idaho Department of Labor. The WIOA program will pay these youth. The Idaho Department of Labor pays for up to 520 hours of work-based learning at \$11.00 per hour and covers workers compensation. It is an opportunity for young adults to develop good work habits and basic employment skills. These services are designed to meet the needs of out-of-school youth.

COMMITTEE MEETING UPDATE

Commissioner Buhler reported Idaho Transportation Department will keep working on the Interstate and Highways this year as long as they can and continue next year. ITD told him the accident rate has decreased significantly since the COVID 19 has kept people at home.

Commissioner Bolduc stated he has a SIRCOMM meeting this week.

Sheriff Gough left correspondence he received titled "Moment of Truth" regarding the murder of George Floyd.

The Commissioners received an email from Cora Isaac's in hopes of allowing the fair to proceed.
