**SNAKE RIVER DETENTION JOINT POWERS AGREEMENT
QUARTERLY DEPARTMENT JUVENILE CORRECTION**

Twin Falls County owns and runs the Snake River Detention Center that is utilized by several counties. Revenues are down due to a lower occupancy of juveniles; therefore they would like to restructure the payment plan for the other counties. They have talked about a membership with a daily charge or a higher daily rate. They will continue working on their plan that will be effective fiscal 2021.

Carol Johnson, Juvenile Probation Officer, presented the 4th Quarter Department of Juvenile Corrections report. The report shows Gooding County has served three juveniles in the SUDS and 2 in the CBAS.

CORRESPONDENCE

SOUTH CENTRAL PUBLIC HEALTH DISTRICT

The Board received in the mail today a letter from South Central Public Health District. Commissioner Bolton moved to vote for Brent Reinke, Twin Falls County nomination to the South Central Public Health District. Commissioner Buhler seconded the motion. Motion carried.

COMMITTEE MEETINGS

Commissioner Bolton attended the City of Gooding meeting where they discussed creating an urban renewal district. The urban renewal district cannot be more than 10% of the City. The area they spoke about was Main Street, Gooding and the industrial park area of Gooding.

Barbara Messick, Gooding Soil Conservation District, received notice from the USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service that they need to vacate their office space. Commissioner Bolton told Ms. Messick the county may have space available for a short term lease.

Gooding County resident, Judd Astorquia, contacted Commissioner Bolton regarding a complaint he received regarding the dust his farming is creating at the airport. He was also told he could lose his property by eminent domain. Commissioner Bolton reassured him that the County would not be taking his property by eminent domain.

Commissioner Bolduc reported SIRCOMM is working on the radio problems and should be resolved soon.

ROSEMARY ANDERSON

DEPUTIES NOT WEARING MASKS

Rosemary Anderson questioned why employees do not have to wear masks. Jeromy Smith, Chief Deputy Sheriff, explained to Mrs. Anderson, that their office screens their employees. Mrs. Anderson feels that everyone should wear a mask and that the deputies at the door should give social distancing for those entering or exiting the building if they are not going to wear masks.

Ms. Lowe will see if it can serve for the required Transition Plan.

Region IV is going to obtain information on possible grants to assist Gooding County with their other needs.
