

**REGULAR SESSION, JUNE 13, 2022**

Commissioner Bolduc opened the meeting at 1:03 a.m. Commissioner Buhler, Commissioner Bolton and the Clerk, Denise Gill were present.

**INDIGENT**

Commissioner Buhler moved to go into an executive session pursuant to IC§31-874 to consider indigent matters. Commissioner Bolton seconded the motion. Roll call vote: Bolton-Yes, Buhler- Yes, Bolduc-Yes. Director, Kaitlin Leguineche joined the meeting. The board recessed executive session and returned to regular session at 1:35 p.m. Commissioners Buhler and Bolton moved and seconded to deny 5023, 5027 and 5016. Motion carried. Commissioner Bolton moved to accept a payoff of 75% of the existing debt on 2635, 1899 and 3233. Commissioner Buhler seconded the motion. Motion carried.

**SOUTH CENTRAL COMMUNITY ACTION**

Ken Robinette and Mari from the South Central Community Action, joined the meeting. They explained the five core programs; Emergency Services/Family Stability-Homeless Prevention & Rapid-Rehousing, Energy Conservation/Weatherization, Food Distribution, Heat Assistance and Housing. Last year, they helped 3,913 Families and 10,300 Individuals. In Gooding County, they served 137 families and 266 individuals.

**SOLID WASTE FEE**

Stephanie Kelly and Nate Francisco, from Southern Idaho Solid Waste District joined the meeting, via Zoom. The two reviewed the Southern Idaho Solid Waste Fee FY2023 Budget Request. The group agreed to a \$20 increase bring the fee to \$75 per unit. Commissioner Bolton moved that we anticipate raising the solid waste fee to \$75.00 per unit and schedule a public hearing for that increase. Commissioner Buhler seconded the motion. Motion carried.
